Description: Hall County Schools' high school summer program provides an opportunity for "credit recovery" for students who have failed one or more courses needed for high school graduation. The program is provided through one-on-one, online instruction through a program called e2020. Designed to help students graduate on time from high school, e2020 courses are aligned to the state curriculum, and are customized & self-paced. Each student will begin an e2020 course by taking a "prescriptive" assessment. This assessment will by-pass the part of the curriculum that the student has already mastered, then customize a course based upon the knowledge & skills the student has not mastered. Since all courses are taught using technology, students who have an internet connection may work from home, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Students may also work on courses at LCA during the days & hours shown above. Students must take all tests at the LCA campus – no tests will be available to students at home.

*\*Note: To complete an e2020 course during the summer, a student should be logged on and "active" at least five hours per day. Students who spend less than five hours per day on e2020 program risk not finishing a course by the end of the session. No refunds are provided for students who do not complete a class by the end of the summer session. Students who do not complete a summer e2020 course will have an opportunity to finish (at no cost) when the new school year begins.*

Grading: With e2020, the intent is to help a student recover the credit as quickly as possible. Since students only repeat the sections of the curriculum that have not been mastered, the maximum grade a student can achieve in the credit recovery summer school program is 70%. Students wanting to earn higher than 70% must repeat the course during the regular school year. Students who do not achieve mastery by the end of the summer session will have an opportunity to finish the course when the new school year begins.

All parents must sign & return the Behavior Contract by Wednesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>. Students who have not returned the contract by this date will not be allowed to test or attend class on campus until the contract is returned.

Courses will only be offered to students who have previously taken a course and failed. Credit recovery lab teachers will facilitate all online courses. These courses will include:
