

The Scoop on College Admission Testing NHHS

1. **Seniors should be finished with their College Admission Testing by September of 2011. If you are considering Early Action for UGA or NGCSU I recommend being complete by September. The last ACT is in September for early admission applicants.**
2. If you are heading to a state technical college, you need to take the **ASSET**. We offer the **ASSET** in the fall and spring there is no charge. Schedule dates are placed on Infinite Campus and on school announcement board.
3. If you are heading to a 2 year community / private college or 4 year school, **take the ACT**. See the attached schedule and sign up quickly. Our analysis of recent tests scores of NHHS has shown that far too many students are taking the SAT **unprepared**. The ACT is based on high school subject matter, our students overwhelmingly report they find the test less stressful and all schools accepts the ACT without question. Please **DO NOT** take the SAT “cold” to see how you will do. **ALL students must consult with Ms. Oxford first.**

❖ The SAT has become a high stakes test for NHHS. **Please** consult with Kathy Oxford **before** signing up for the SAT. **Preparation is required for success.**
4. Some students are heading to schools with rigorous admissions standards and require the SAT II subject exams. You may register for these subject tests through the SAT testing service. They are one hour long and available throughout the area. Most schools expect three, so check with your prospective school and see what they want you to do.
5. North Hall High School will once again be a testing sight for ACT/SAT. Check the ACT material for 2011 – 2012 to get details. Always bring your school ID / drivers license for positive identification. ACT SATURDAY TEST DATES @ NHHS: 9/10/11; 12/10/11; 4/4/12
6. If you are not sure what you want to study at the college of choice, plan on taking the **ASVAB**. This test can really assist you in picking the major that is best for your skills, aptitude, and personality. The test is free of charge and given once or twice per year at NHHS.
