More information on requirements for Georgia teen drivers

The following information is being provided to help clarify the new law affecting any Georgia student who will be 16-years-old in 2007 and who chooses to apply for a Class D Driver's License.

What is "Joshua's Law"?

Senate Bill 226 also known as "Joshua's Law" was passed during the 2005 General Assembly. Beginning January 1, 2007, all 16-year-olds applying for a Class D driver's license must complete an approved driver education course AND complete a total of 40 hours of supervised driving, 6 hours of which must be at night, with a parent or guardian's sworn verification that these driving requirements have been met.

Any Georgia student who has not completed an approved driver education course must wait until age 17 to be eligible for a Class D driver's license. He or she must still complete a total of at least 40 hours of supervised driving, including at least 6 hours at night. The same verification in writing by a parent or guardian is required. In lieu of a professional driver's education course a student may take a state licensed 30 hour driver's education course on-line.

Students do not need a learner's permit for the classroom course or the virtual/online program; however, they will need to hold a learner's permit for 1 year and 1 day prior to being issued a Class D license. A learner's permit is required for the behind-the-wheel driving. Students can complete their supervised driving hours concurrent to taking a driver's education class provided that they have a learner's permit.
