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# What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment is a unique program that allows high school students to earn college credit toward a postsecondary certificate, diploma, or degree at a Georgia college while simultaneously earning credit toward their high school diploma.



# Why Dual Enrollment?

- Free Books/Tuition/Select Fees
- Ability to participate in both high school and college events & activities, excluding sororities/fraternities and collegiate athletics
- Jump start on college and career opportunities
- Funded by another source that does not count against HOPE/ZELL hours
- Students may continue enrollment in other high school courses
- Use of college facilities and services
- Students may matriculate from DE to traditional freshman status
- Transportation provided from home high school to IEC and LCCA
- Provided with one period off per college course to allow time for travel



# Why Dual Enrollment?

- Eases the transition from high school to college
- Helps students become more comfortable in a college setting
- Allows the student to develop successful collegiate-level study habits
- Encourages students to engage with professors and seek resources for assistance
- Prepares students for many career opportunities after high school graduation
- Dual Enrollment General Education coursework transfers between all USG and TCSG institutions
- Follows Hall County School District's school calendar at IEC and LCCA
- Main campus students follow the college schedule/calendar



# Why Dual Enrollment?

Grades earned in Dual Enrollment courses are weighted in the High School GPA as shown below.

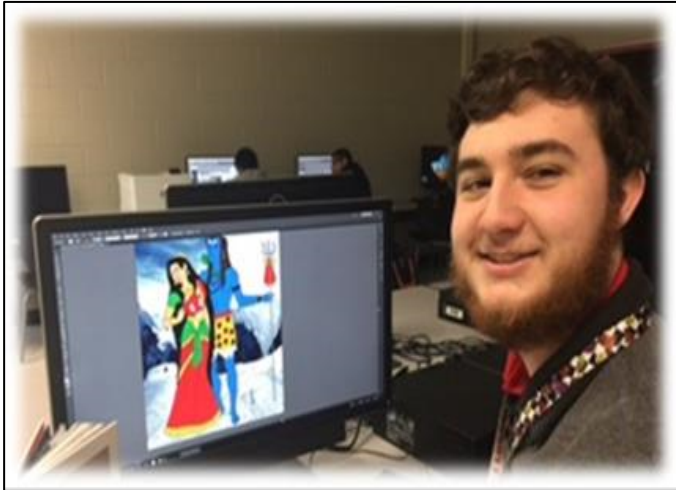




# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options



## Animation & Game Design



Prepares students on industry standard software to work in animation & interfaces for the game development industry, simulation development, model fantasy characters for games, and other web related fields.



## Criminal Justice\*



Prepares students for Criminal Justice professions in corrections, security, investigation, or police administration. Learning opportunities develop academic, occupational, and professional knowledge and skills required for job acquisition, retention, and advancement.

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# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options



## Design & Media Production



Prepares students in marketing and design concepts for web design, animation, and print layout using Illustrator and Photo Shop.



## Early Childhood Care & Education\*



Prepares students for employment in early care and education settings, including child care centers, Head Start, and Georgia Pre-K programs. This certificate meets the Bright from the Start/Day Care licensing teaching credential requirement.

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# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options



## Esthetician



Prepares students for employment in salons, spas, and medical offices. Completion of this program prepares students to sit for the Esthetics licensure examination given by the Georgia State Board of Cosmetology.



## Events Coordinator



Prepares students for employment in a variety of positions in today's Hotel/Restaurant/Tourism fields.



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# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options



## Firefighter I



Prepares students for the firefighter certification test through a two-year certificate cohort model. Upon passing the certification test, students are ready to be hired right out of high school. Space is limited and this program is open to juniors and seniors only.



## Food Production Worker



Prepares students with basic entry-level skills for employment in the food service industry as prep cooks and banquet or service prep workers.



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# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options



## Health Information Tech Specialist



Prepares students for the Healthcare Information Management Technology Degree program by introducing them to the career of health informatics.



## Industrial Electrician\*



Prepares students for employment using basic electrical maintenance skills with instruction in the areas of industrial safety, direct and alternating current principles, and industrial wiring.

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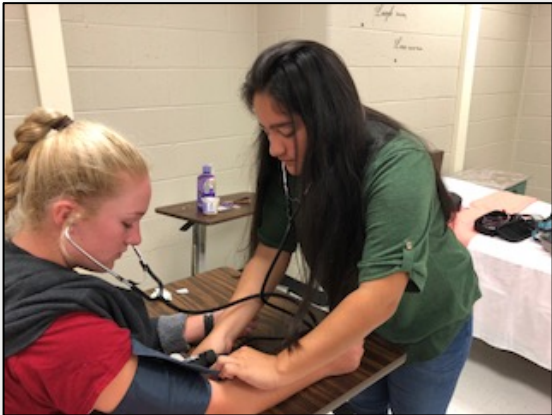
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# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options



## Nurse Aide (CNA)



Prepares students for a position as a nurse aid after only one semester and passing the CNA test. Space is limited and this program is open to juniors and seniors only.



## Prep Cook



Prepares students with the skills necessary for entry into the food services profession as a prep cook. Learning topics include principles of cooking, menu development and design, and safety and sanitation.



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# Dual Enrollment Certificate Options

## WELDER



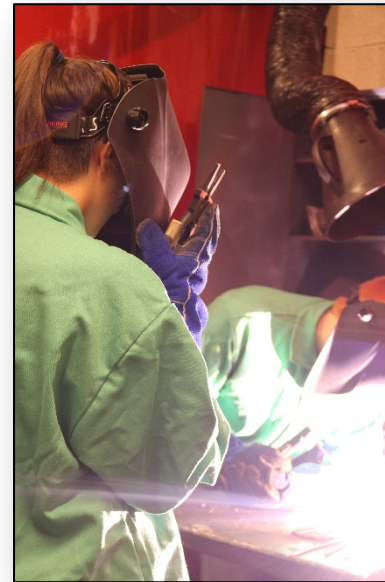
### Basic Shielded Metal Arc Welder



Prepares students for careers in the welding and joining industry with an emphasis on arc welding in the flat position. This certificate is a pre-requisite to the advanced certificate.



### Gas Metal Arc Welder



Prepares students for welding careers in the MIG process with topics including an introduction to welding technology, oxyfuel cutting techniques, and MIG welding techniques and processes.

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# Dual Enrollment Student Expectations

- Conduct themselves in a mature manner and be prepared for the rigor of college classes including study time
- Attend all scheduled classes & complete assigned work on time
- Communicate with professor and gain permission prior to any class(es) missed  
College advisor should be copied on email or follow up email
- Return books in acceptable condition after each semester
- Maintain a minimum –
  - **2.0 GPA (Lanier Tech & Brenau)**
  - **2.5 GPA (UNG)**

*Students with IEP/504 plans should seek assistance from the  
Office of Student Disability Services regarding permitted services within each student's college courses.*



# Dual Enrollment: Other Considerations

- Only 15 hours of credit will be paid per semester at LT and UNG;  
12 hours at Brenau
- When high school credit is earned for DE courses, a high school unit of credit is determined at the following rate:

Semester Hours	Units of Credit	Quarter Hours	Units of Credit
3-6 hrs.	1.0	4-8 hrs.	1.0
1-2 hrs.	0.5	1-3 hrs.	0.5

- Online classes also available through UNG, Brenau and LT
- Students may take classes through more than one institution
- Students may drive with permission
