
























Elementary Community Schools



Schoolwide Enrichment Model


- Identifies and develops student interests

School Wide Enrichment Model

- Parallel Curriculum based on the research of Renzulli and Reis
- 3 levels of implementation: Exposure, Cluster Groups, Service Learning
- Sample Cluster Group Choices: Art Studio, Fitness, Chorus, Culinary, Fabric Arts, Cosmetology, Lego Robotics, and Pod Casting.
 - Allows students to begin thinking about talents, interests, and associated career pathways
 - All students will have the opportunity to explore three questions:
 - What am I good at?
- What am I interested in?
 - How can I use my interests and talents to choose a job for my future?







TADMORE ELEMENTARY A COMMUNICATION MAGNET SCHOOL

Tadmore Elementary Communication Magnet is a school-wide program where students explore communication as a part of daily instruction in all content areas. We believe that students require a structured and supportive environment in which they are encouraged and challenged to listen for understanding, speak with clarity and engage in purposeful 'accountable talk" to explore a variety of topics.

PUBLIC SPEAKING Teachers support speaking and listening skills by providing students with core academic content and related vocabulary, asking open-ended questions, engaging students in conversational, procedural, and other specific types of talk, and providing opportunities for students to speak and listen to each other. Communication through written word, art, music, movement, and digital formats is a component of daily instruction.

Discovering Our Gifts Academy

Discovering Our Gifts (DOG) Academy: The D.O.G. Academy is for high achieving 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students, where learners have opportunities to learn, transfer, and apply their understanding of the content while developing research, technology, and inquiry skills to become competitive 21st century learners. The students learn how content connects and relates to other topics, disciplines, events, time, and cultures. The D.O.G. classroom allows the students to work independently, collaboratively, and through whole groups depending on the assignment, concept, needs, and delivery model.

Promoting Unlimited Potential (P.U.P.) Academy begins in 2nd grade. The students in our P.U.P. academy classrooms have advanced curriculum in specific concept areas, move at a faster pace, and use in depth hands-on activities through a variety of learning experiences. The classrooms focus on allowing the students to develop a deeper understanding of concepts while providing opportunities to participate in project based learning, teamwork, and problem solving activities.

Spanish Dual Language Path



- Program of Choice in Kindergarten & Grades K-4
- Students will receive 50% of instruction in English; 50% in Spanish
- English and Spanish-speaking students learn together
- Academic subjects are taught in Spanish and English
- Enrollment open to Hall County District students, as space allows

How Do I Apply to an elementary magnet school or program of choice? Please start by registering your kindergartener or child at your zoned elementary school.

- Please register your child at his/her zoned elementary school. See the link below for more information, including what is necessary for parents to bring to registration. Enrolling kindergarteners should accompany parents for pre-registration.

- Kindergarten registration will be held at each of the Hall County School District elementary schools on:
 - March 24 26, 2020

In order to be enrolled, children entering kindergarten must be five (5) years of age on or before September 1, 2020.

How do I apply to an Elementary Magnet School?

- For all Elementary Magnet Schools, applications are due by March 16, 2020.
- Please go to the magnet school's website for specific magnet school application procedures.
- Rising kindergarteners must first be registered at their zoned elementary school.
- Letters will be mailed by April 3.
- Please respond by April 17.

What happens next?

- If accepted, you either accept or decline the magnet invitation.
- Your new magnet school will request registration records from your child's zoned elementary school.
- For magnet schools, if you are not accepted, you may still apply for a transfer via HB 251.
