A Tale of Two Programs

Core

(5.0 scale just like high school AP/IB classes)

&

Certificates

(4.5 scale just like high school Honors classes)



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Eligibility Vs Readiness

Points To Consider:

- Student's **maturity** level
- Academic **rigor** of college classes
- **Commitment** to: Turning in assignments on time; Asking for help; Showing GRIT; Attending classes
- **Initiative** in college classes vs high school



Students need to be both Eligible and Ready



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Why Dual Enrollment?

- Free books and tuition for almost all core and certificate classes
- One college class = two high school periods
- One semester = yearlong credit (3 hour credit classes = 1 full HS credit)
- Ability to participate in high school classes & activities; use of college facilities, services and participate in college events (excluding playing NCAA sports)
- Get a jump start on college and ease the transition from high school to college
- CORE Dual Enrollment coursework (Lanier Tech and UNG) transfers between all USG and TCSG institutions. Many Brenau University classes transfer as well



Dual Enrollment Considerations

- **Important Regulations:**

- MAXIMUM of 30 hours of Free Tuition & Books (does not count toward HOPE hours)
- Students lose funding eligibility after two course withdrawals
- DE funding will not cover course re-takes
- Selective Service registration requirement
- Main campus students must follow the college schedule/calendar and provide their own transportation to and from the college

2 Year Cohort



- Cohort will consist of 2 DE blocks each (equivalent of four HS periods) beginning junior year of high school.
- Students will take classes to gain their CNA certificate, 4th math credit, Psychology 1101, and other core classes.
- Students will continue their cohort learning in advanced science curriculum.

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Ivester Rising Scholars Program: Agriculture and Environmental Sciences



- Cohort will consist of DE blocks at IEC and a class at **UGA** for student's senior year.
- Students must be currently involved in or show a dedication to an Ag or Environmental Sciences area.
- Students are selected through an admissions process – apply Nov.

Coursework:

CAES IRSP students will enroll as a cohort in approved CAES courses offered fall 2022 and spring 2023. Classes are delivered in-person with current UGA students.

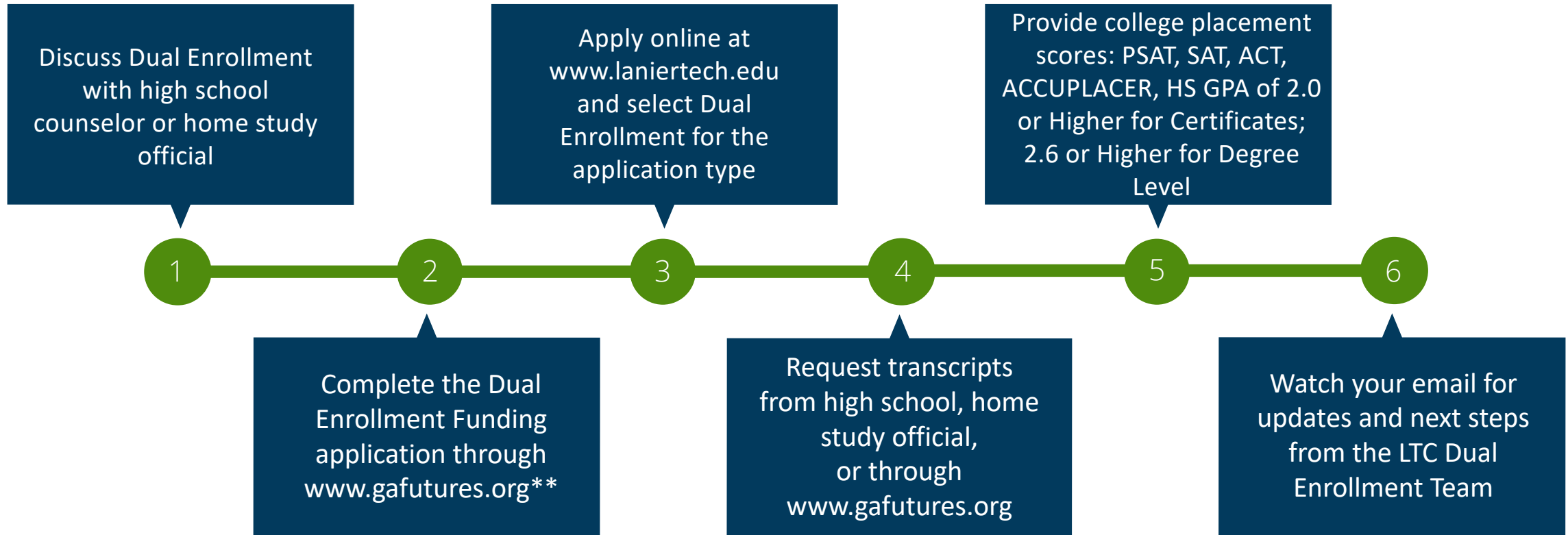

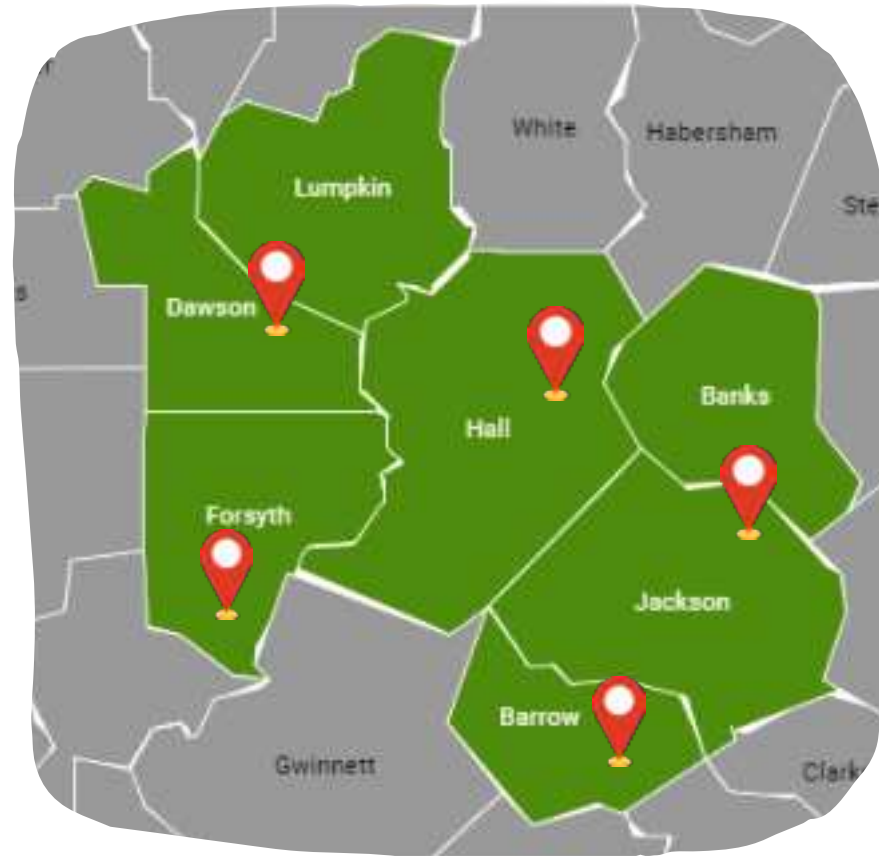

UNG COURSE MODALITIES



F - FULLY AT A DISTANCE

All or nearly all of the class sessions are delivered via technology. The course does not require students to travel to a classroom for instruction; however, it might require students to travel to a site to attend an orientation or to take exams.



F2F - FACE TO FACE

All of the class sessions are conducted in person in a classroom or lab. There may be online components of the class, but these are to supplement the in class instruction.



H1 - HYBRID: 25-50% F2F

Technology is used to deliver 50-75 percent of class sessions. Segments of the class attend the classroom on a regular rotation based on classroom capacity with social distancing. **Students will be notified by their professor of their attendance requirements prior to the first day of class.**

SUCCESSFUL STUDENT HABITS

- **Communicate Proactively**
 - Check UNG student email regularly
 - Reach out to professors and advisor as soon as the need arises
- **Time Management**
 - Follow UNG's academic and holiday calendars
 - Mandatory class attendance and importance of not being tardy (*UNG Dual Enrollment absence policy*)
 - Follow-up and follow through on action items
- **Utilize Available Resources**
 - Access FREE tutoring services even if you aren't struggling
 - Bolster your research projects with help from our librarians
 - Students with high school IEP/504 plans are encouraged to seek assistance from UNG's Student Accessibility Services office as these plans do not carry over without notification.
- **Maintain a cumulative post-secondary GPA of 2.5 or higher**



ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

A potential Dual Enrollment student must:

- Be entering their junior or senior year of high school at the time of enrollment.
- Present a cumulative 3.25 unweighted RHSC GPA
- Meet the minimum test score requirements
