Perpetrators of domestic violence often hurt family pets to control and intimidate their victims. Ahimsa House, Inc. - a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose name means "nonviolence" - is dedicated to helping the human and animal victims of domestic violence across Georgia reach safety together.

Our Direct Services Program

- A 24-hour statewide crisis line Emergency shelter for animals of any kind while their owners reach safety from domestic violence
- Veterinary care for pets with injuries and other health conditions due to the abuse, as well as preventive veterinary care and spay/neuter Forensic veterinary examinations to document abuse and assist in prosecuting abusers
- Assistance in transporting pets to accompany their owners to safety (both within GA and across the country)
- Pet food, pet supplies, payment of pet deposits in transitional housing, and other assistance victims may need Crates and other pet supplies for domestic violence shelters, including shelters that have their own on-site housing for pets
- Assistance in including pets in safety planning
- Legal advocacy to assist victims in listing their pets on temporary protective orders.

Outreach Services Program

- Training and cross-training for a wide range of human services and animal protection agencies
- Direct outreach to the public to raise awareness about this issue, including speaking at meetings of civic organizations, setting up information booths at community festivals and workplace health fairs, and placing information brochures and posters in veterinary clinics and other strategic locations across the state
- Consultation to prosecutors on cases involving co-occurring animal cruelty and domestic violence, including expert witness services
- A directory of programs of this type elsewhere
- Participating in interdisciplinary conferences and meetings, such as Domestic Violence Task Forces, to keep the issue of animal abuse in domestic violence "at the table"

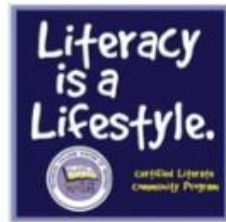

Al-Anon recognizes that alcoholism is a family disease. The disease affects all those who have a relationship with a problem drinker. Alcoholism may emotionally, spiritually, and often physically affect loved ones in addition to the drinker. Al-Anon and Alateen's primary purpose is to help friends and families of alcoholics. However, many of our members first came because a friend or relative had a drug problem. Most eventually came to realize that someone else's drinking had also negatively affected their lives.

Alateen meetings are for young people, usually teenagers, whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. While Alateen members run their own meetings, adult Group Sponsors are there for safety and to provide guidance. To ensure the safety of Alateen meeting, Group Sponsors must be in compliance with Alateen Safety and Behavioral Requirements. Alateen helps young people understand how alcoholism affects the lives of all who are associated with a problem drinker and helps them find effective ways to deal with their personal problems. Al-Anon meetings welcome and encourage teens to participate in their meetings. Where there are no Alateen groups, teens are encouraged to participate in Al-Anon meetings. - There are no dues or fees. Members make voluntary contributions because each group is self-supporting.
- No appointments are necessary. Anyone concerned about someone else's drinking is welcome to walk in and attend.
- Anonymity is protected. The identity of all Al-Anon and Alateen members, as well as members of Alcoholics Anonymous, are protected.
- Al-Anon is a separate fellowship from Alcoholics Anonymous.

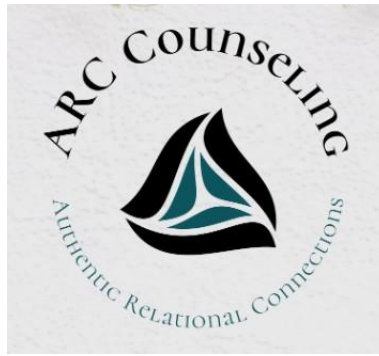

Youth Services:

- **Mental Health Services:** Avita offers a variety of outpatient treatment services for youth and their families. Licensed staff members work with children and adolescents to enhance their mental, emotional, and social functioning by giving them the tools they need to succeed.
- **Substance Abuse Services:** It is vital to reach youth who are facing addictive diseases early. Our adolescent substance abuse treatment program provides assessment and treatment for addiction at community facilities that are close to home.
- **Crisis Prevention And Intervention services** are available to prevent crisis through rapid response to critical situations. Our trained staff provides supportive counseling, consultation, and identification of resources and referrals.
- **Medical:** Depending on treatment needs, medical services may be available including physician and nursing care, medication management, and pharmacy services.

Adult Behavioral Health Programs:

- **Psychoeducational Classes and Counseling** Avita offers short-term individual, family, and group educational and counseling services to help you and your family acquire knowledge and self-help skills for coping, problem solving, and recovery. Victim Services Program is dedicated to providing no-cost, therapeutic counseling to children and teenagers aged 3 to 17 who have experienced sexual abuse. Recognizing that each child's healing journey is unique, our licensed therapists employ a variety of evidence-based techniques, including: Play Therapy, Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TFCBT), Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR). Sessions are offered in individual, group, and family settings, allowing for a comprehensive approach to healing that involves both the child and their support system. A vital part of our Victim Services Program focuses on equipping non-offending parents and caregivers with the tools, education, and encouragement they need to support their child's recovery journey. For teenagers, group therapy sessions provide a space to connect with peers who have undergone similar experiences. These sessions help adolescents realize they are not alone, fostering a sense of solidarity and shared strength that is vital for recovery.

Adult Services: We offer compassionate, trauma-informed care for adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse—providing the tools, support, and space needed to process the past, reclaim identity, and build a future rooted in strength and hope.

Project Pathfinder: Redirecting Harmful Behaviors - Helping youth who display problematic sexual behaviors develop empathy, accountability, and healthier ways to relate—while supporting families every step of the way.

Prevention: Prevention Through Knowledge - We offer training, workshops, and expert consultations to help prevent child sexual abuse before it occurs—giving educators, caregivers, and community leaders the knowledge and confidence to create safer environments for every child.

Our Mission

The mission of the Cresswind LL Community Fund is to enhance the lives of adults primarily 55 and older through charitable, educational, medical health-related, and cultural opportunities exclusively in Gainesville and Hall County.

Our Daily Activity and Purpose

The Cresswind LL Community Fund does two things: Raise Funds through campaigns, programs and donations, then Grant those Funds to local seniors in need, and organizations that serve seniors. To do that it currently takes 17 Leadership Team members and about 95 other Volunteers giving part of their time to help local seniors in need. The Community Fund has about 1,290 Cresswind resident members and continues to grow. To become a member, you must be a Cresswind resident and make a one-time membership donation of any amount.

The [Grandparents Raising Grandchildren program](#) provides one-time emergency financial support to grandparents raising grandchildren. This occurs when the grandparents have been hit by circumstances which have caused them to get behind in their financial obligations. This can occur when an illness happens, when a job changes, a large repair is necessary or other unexpected circumstances occur. All potential candidates are interviewed in person and their needs are assessed. Recommendations are made to the Community Fund's Board of Directors for funding approval.

This program covers expenses such as rent or mortgage payments, utility payments, car payments or other basic necessities. Payments are made directly to the provider and not to the grandparent. This emergency aid keeps the family from being evicted, going without utilities, without a car to get to their job, or other basic needs.

The Homestead: This centralized campus gives FPHC the ability to serve additional families with one or more parents who work evening or nighttime hours. It also allows for more efficient use of staff and operational resources and greater stability for families and their children as they progress through the FPHC program(s) to sustainable independence.

Empowerment Program: Helping low-income families through sheltering and intensive case management to achieve lasting independence

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have children. We work exclusively with families with children. Any family or individual applying for our program must have at least one child in their custody.
- Must be able and willing to work. We are a work-oriented program focused on families regaining independence by finding consistent, reliable employment.
- Must not have a current situation involving domestic violence. Our facility is not equipped to handle situations with an imminent threat of domestic violence.
- Must work or seek employment in Hall County. Children must be enrolled in local schools.
- Must be willing to comply with our Guest Contract and Guidelines. We require that families comply with a basic code of conduct and meet specific expectations. For example, we do not tolerate drugs, alcohol, or violence. A drug screen will be required prior to entering the program.
- Must pay a \$100 entry fee upon program entry. The fee will be prorated depending on the week of entry.

Next Step Program: Providing a longer-term affordable housing solution to graduates of the Empowerment Program

The Little Steps Community Daycare (LSCD) is a program of Family Promise of Hall County that serves children ages 6 weeks to 4 years from vulnerable, low-income families in Hall County.

- **Hall County Detention Center Programs**—a weekly meeting for women and men who are incarcerated

- **Equine Therapy**—helping adolescents develop bonding and trust, as well as developing leadership skills.

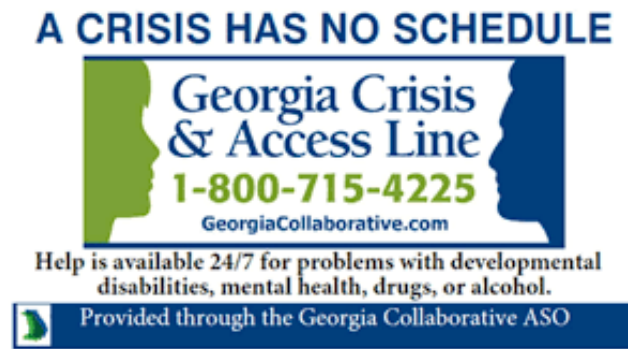

Callers are connected to Behavioral Health professionals who conduct brief clinical assessments and then collaborate with the caller on determining the appropriate community linkage to assist them during the crisis.

In Georgia, 988 and GCAL (Georgia Crisis and Access Line) work together as a unified team. When you dial 988 from a Georgia area code, your call, text, or chat is directly answered by the GCAL crisis center. Both services feed into the exact same team of trained mental health professionals 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

Good Samaritan Food Ministries was created to assist and minister to those who are in need. We offer distribution of food, furniture, counseling, job placement training, health screenings and more for individuals and their families.

Our goal at Good Samaritan Food Ministries is to impact the lives of those we assist through food, education, and counseling. In return, they may reach their full potential physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Our core values of compassion, integrity, respect, security, stewardship, and family guide our operations and services.

Food Pantry - Good Samaritan Food Ministries allows individuals and families to register for food monthly. Individuals who qualify for our food pantry receive a large box of food once a month, which includes non-perishables, bread, desserts, fresh vegetables, meats, dairy products, fruits, and drinks. However, we encourage all clients to visit the food pantry as often as needed during their 30-day period to receive breads, sweets, and other items as they are available.

Child and Adolescent Health

Health Check provides well-child physical for children 0-21 years of age with Medicaid or PeachCare.

Child Health provides well-child physicals for non-Medicaid or PeachCare children 0-21 years of age on a sliding fee scale.

The Immunizations Program provides vaccinations to protect children against vaccine preventable diseases and ensure appropriate shots are given for school admission. Immunization records and school certificates are provided to parents and guardians. Adult immunizations are also offered.

Children With Special Needs

Children 1st (C1st) Children 1st helps families by offering developmental screening and connection to medical homes, public health programs and other local services or resources that help babies, toddlers, and preschoolers (through their 5th birthday) grow up healthy and thrive.

Babies Can't Wait (BCW) This program serves Georgia families of children from birth to three years of age who have disabilities or significant developmental delays.

Children's Medical Services (CMS) This program provides medical care to children from birth to 21 years of age who have disabling conditions or chronic diseases. The goal of CMS is to help each child reach his or her maximum potential.

Early Hearing Detection & Intervention (EHDI) Newborn hearing screening is screening for hearing loss. All babies should be screened for hearing loss before 1 month of age. The screening is typically done before the baby leaves the birthing facility.

EHDI includes screening for hearing loss in the birthing hospital; referral of those who do not pass the hospital screening for rescreening; for newborns who do not pass the rescreening referral for diagnostic audiological evaluation; and, linkage to appropriate intervention for those babies diagnosed with hearing loss

Dental - The District 2 Pediatric Dental Program is one of the largest in the state and services are available to children up to 21 years of age who have medicaid or PeachCare insurance. Patients without insurance can also be seen on a fee basis. Children can be seen as early as 1 year of age for anticipatory guidance screening exams **Services Include:** Education on preventing dental disease, X-rays, Fluoride treatment, Restoration of teeth with cavities (fillings), Treatment of oral infections, Dental screenings and oral examinations, Teeth cleanings, Sealants on permanent molars, Extractions of non-restorable teeth, Referrals for hospital pediatric dental treatment

Immunizations - Stay up to date on getting recommended vaccines for you and your family.

Camp Braveheart is a day camp, provided at no cost, for children and youth who have experienced the death of a close friend or family member. Founded in 1995 by the Hospice of Northeast Georgia Medical Center, the Braveheart Program has provided grief support to over 1000 children via the camp experience and school-based support groups. What is the Kinship Navigator Program?

The Kinship Navigator Program serves as a one-stop shop for information and referral services to grandparents, relatives and other caregivers who are currently raising a child.

Who does the Kinship Navigator Program serve?

A kinship caregiver serves as a short or long-term caregiver for relative child(ren). A kinship caregiver can be a grandparent, aunt, uncle, sibling or anyone who has established a 'kin-like' bond with the child(ren). The majority of kinship care arrangements are informal, private arrangements between parents and relative caregivers, while other situations arise as a result of involvement with the child welfare system.

How will a Kinship Navigator assist me?

The kinship navigators are located statewide to assist kinship families in identifying and locating resources within their local community. The program's overarching goal is to close the gaps and/or delays with service delivery to kinship caregivers. The Department of Human Services focuses on providing a responsive strength-based supportive role to our kinship families.

Laurelwood is part of Northeast Georgia Medical Center and is conveniently located on the Medical Center's campus in Gainesville. A 54-bed facility, Laurelwood is a private, not-for-profit, inpatient behavioral health facility dedicated to the stabilization and treatment of individuals with mental illness and/or substance abuse. A recognized leader in the region, Laurelwood is committed to improving the health of our community in all that we do. Professional, competent and compassionate staff is what separates Laurelwood from other treatment facilities. Our team is attentive to the individual needs of each patient. We are dedicated to providing high quality services that promote a positive therapeutic treatment experience.

Assessment Services are usually the entry point to mental health services. All assessments are provided by trained professionals we call Intake Specialists. The Intake Specialist will sit down with the patient and support persons (or other collateral contact as available), ask a few questions and discuss the current situation.

Inpatient Hospitalization is the highest level of treatment offered at Laurelwood. This service is designed to provide continuous treatment for individuals with acute psychiatric or substance abuse problems. Each patient will see a psychiatrist daily and all supportive therapy, nursing, and medical care is provided under the supervision of the psychiatrist. The average length of stay in our Inpatient Hospitalization program is 3 – 5 days.

The program is intended to assist the patient in symptom management & reduction and relapse prevention. Patients will participate in a comprehensive, holistic program that includes daily psychiatric care, medication management, nursing care, activity therapy, group therapy, individual and family therapy. Patients benefit from a variety of therapeutic interventions as well as psychoeducation.

Discharge planning begins at the time of admission. Once the interdisciplinary treatment team agrees that the patient is appropriate for discharge, the behavioral therapist will work with the patient to outline the specific discharge plan. At this point, the patient will be given discharge instructions, complete with after care appointments, contact information and community resources. The purpose of discharge planning is to ensure continuity of care as the patient continues in his/her recovery.

Laurelwood offers Inpatient Hospitalization to both adults and adolescents (adolescents age 12 through 17), with one adolescent unit and two adult units available. For adults, the determination of unit is based primarily on presenting symptoms and bed availability.

P4HB® provides no cost family planning services to eligible women in Georgia.

There are three levels of service:

Family planning only - family planning and family planning related services for eligible participants for the duration of the waiver.

Inter-pregnancy care (IPC) - family planning and additional services for women who have delivered a VLBW (less than 1500 grams or 3 pounds 5 ounces) baby for a 24 months duration.

Resource Mother only - inclusive of a specially trained case manager to women on traditional Medicaid plans who have delivered a VLBW baby for a 24 months duration.

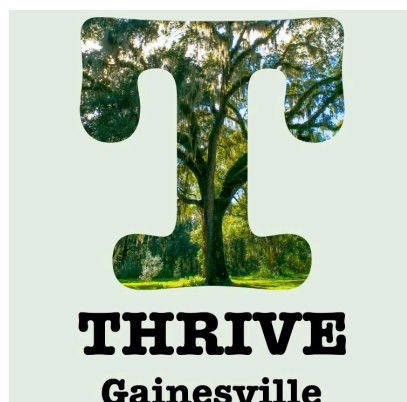

Our Mission Statement

WAYR is a faith-based non-profit that is dedicated to providing hope, healing, love and acceptance to young minds, through the spirit and love of a horse, in a nurturing farm environment. The ranch facilitates healing to those children who are facing challenging circumstances in their lives.

Whispering Angels Youth Ranch provides a safe, nurturing environment to facilitate our four pillars including Hope, Healing, Love and Acceptance. The Ranch focuses on children ranging from 8-18 years of age that have faced or are currently facing various challenges in their lives. While we do not provide clinical/medical therapy, the intent is to replenish the heart, mind and soul to a peaceful existence.

Children in our program come for one hour a week. Each child is paired up with a mentor of the same gender and one horse. Our program takes place on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays between 4:00PM and 6:00PM. Due to generous donors our program is completely free of charge!

HORSE TIME - The majority of children who come to WAYR are drawn to the ranch because of the horses. During sessions children will first learn how to groom and care for their horse. After they have successfully learned how to care for their horse they will get the opportunity to learn to lead their horse and eventually will learn how to ride. All riding is done with an adult leading the horse. We do not offer horseback riding lessons.

DEVO TIME - Children who attend the Ranch will likely be involved in group devotional time. During group devotion children and mentors may read the Bible together, read a book together, share about their day, share their struggles and pray together. Community is an important part of a person's walk with God as it opens up our hearts to God and others.

CHORE TIME - Every child and leader pair will complete a small chore during session time. Chores at the Ranch are meant to teach the importance of serving others by giving through the work of your own hands and to also teach responsibility. Often this opportunity empowers children in knowing that their efforts can make a difference to those around them.

ART, WOODSHOP, OR GARDEN TIME - Whispering Angels has two fully stocked buildings specifically for arts and crafts; the art room and the woodshop. We also have a full summer and fall garden. Arts, crafts and time in the garden provide serenity in similar ways as the horses do. In our art room, child and mentor pairs can watercolor paint, acrylic paint, oil paint, throw pottery, make clay models and more. Child and mentor pairs can also spend time in our woodshop. Past woodshop projects have included making birdhouses, swords, chairs, cars and more.

ONE-ON-ONE TIME - Child and mentor pairs may also choose to spend some of their time on the swings, benches or in the grass chatting about life. Although our mentor volunteers are not certified counselors, they are prepared to talk about anything that the child would like to open up about. One-on-one time can be an important part of the child's time at the Ranch because many of the children we serve come from backgrounds of broken hearts and broken trust.
